Expanding Exports

North Carolina ranks 13th among states affected by agricultural export restrictions. More than \$13 million in potential business lost for North Carolina farmers, and additional potential economic output stemming from new farm trade estimated at \$98.8 million to the state's economy. Country-of-Origin Labels

COOL is a marketing tool for American livestock producers to fend off imports of Canadian beef, some of which has been found to contain mad cow disease. A 2004 nationwide poll by the National Farmers Union found 85% of those surveyed would be more likely to buy U.S. labeled products.

Agriculture Research

Farm Service Agency Offices

Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices are run by Tar Heel farmers elected to county committees and these key staffers perform a critical function administering crop and conservation programs.
