SOLD US OUT to CHINA



- **Between 2001-2013 Nevada had 15,200 net jobs displaced due to trade with China.**

 Sen. Heller voted **against** an amendment to make it a principal negotiating objective of the United States to address currency manipulation in trade agreements by requiring enforceable currency provisions in any future trade deals. *Source: H.R. 1314, 5/22/15, Roll call 187*

 Sen. Heller voted **against** the Trade Facilitation and Trade Enforcement Act of 2015, a bill that cracked down on currency manipulation by American trading partners. The bill included provisions to prevent "dumping," a method of predatory pricing used by foreign companies to undercut local markets and drive away competition. *Source: H.R. 644, 5/14/15, Roll call 179*

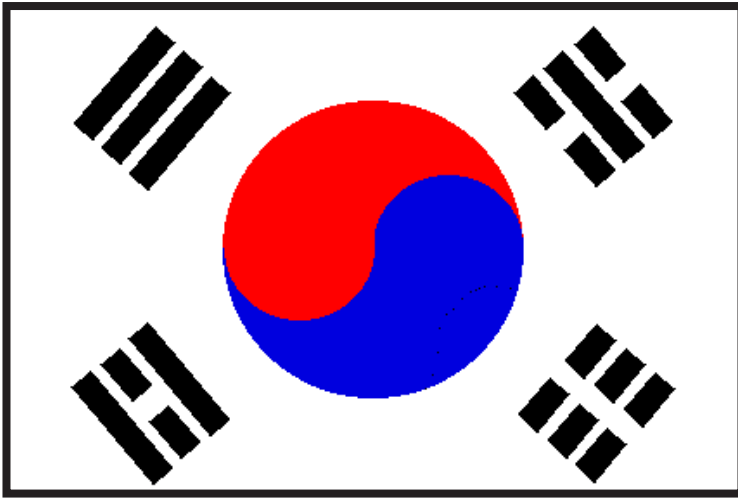

Senator Dean Heller Voted to **SEND OUR JOBS OVERSEAS**



- **The U.S. trade deficit with Korea in the top 10 products that Nevada exports to Korea – including everything from machinery to transportation equipment – grew 46% in the FTA’s first three years (2012 – 2014).** *Source: U.S. International Trade Commission*
- **Between 2012 – 2014, U.S. exports to Korea of milk and wheat – two of Nevada’s top agricultural products – plummeted 91% and 4%, respectively.** *Source: U.S. Department of Agriculture, Foreign Agricultural Service*
- **Between 2011 – 2015, more than 95,000 U.S. jobs were lost due to the growing trade deficits with Korea which increased 99%, or \$15.4 billion.**

 Sen. Heller voted **for** the Korea Free Trade Agreement. Korea is one of only three countries that our government has labeled a currency manipulator. The Korea FTA has no provisions to counter cheating such as currency devaluations which would totally eliminate the purported tariff cut benefits and make our exports more expensive to Koreans than they are now.

 The Korea FTA allows foreign corporations to skirt our U.S. courts and directly challenge our laws before the United Nations and other tribunals to demand compensation from our tax dollars for claimed violations of the trade pact. America shouldn’t be signing trade deals that put taxpayers on the line for payouts we can’t afford to corporations that offshore jobs. *Source: H.R. 3080, 10/12/11, Roll call 161*

Senator Dean Heller **VOTED TO KILL** **RURAL POSTAL SERVICE**

Sen. Heller failed to prevent the closing of the Postal Service's Elko Customer Service Mail Processing Center in June 2012, now mail for northeastern NV must be handled and distributed from Salt Lake City, 227 miles away resulting in longer delivery time for first-class mail.

On January 5, 2015, overnight delivery of first-class mail was virtually eliminated. *Source: U.S. Postal Service*

Sen. Heller voted **against** the 21st Century Postal Service Act of 2012, a bill to improve, sustain and transform the US Postal Service. The bill stopped the immediate closing of up to 252 mail processing centers and 3,700 post offices and placed a one-year moratorium on closing rural post offices. *Source: S. 1789, 4/25/12, Roll call 82*
